"EU@27 - Focus on added value"

The EU is passing through a challenging period of reflecting on its future, following the unprecedented decision of one of its Member States to withdraw. The firm commitment of the other 27 countries to remain united goes hand in hand with their pledge to work for a stronger Europe, which is safe and secure, prosperous, competitive, and socially responsible. The key is to demonstrate to European citizens the added value of continuing to build a Union that adequately and efficiently responds to their needs and concerns.

Europa Forum Lech 2018 takes place less than a year before the European Summit in Sibiu, where the Heads of States and Governments of the 27 member states will decide how the European Union will develop over the years to come. Making Europe more united, stronger and democratic will require the support of all those willing to contribute to the European project, as well as the mobilisation of various political and economic instruments.

The EU budget plays a significant role in bolstering up economic growth and job creation through targeted investments with a broader European dimension. Representing currently only 1% of the combined GNI of its Member States, the EU budget alone cannot respond to the evolving needs of the European cities and regions. Supporting strategic sectors with high growth potential as energy, transport, automotive and digital industry can add up prosperity while strengthening social cohesion and economic convergence.

While backing traditional industries and services, the EU should not just keep pace with the digital revolution, but also strive to remain a front-runner in this area. Fostering research and innovation, stimulating new ideas and transforming them into increased productivity and competitiveness requires the combined efforts of numerous actors. Innovative enterprises, research organisations and institutions, providing funding opportunities and support work together to ensure the EU remains a global referent. The choices they make today will be critical for the place of tomorrow's Europe in the digital world.

Protecting the safety and security of European citizens must still remain an EU priority. Against the backdrop of global uncertainty, migration pressures and terrorist threats, the EU has to adapt to the new internal security challenges and protect its external borders while preserving its core values, liberties and principles.

European Commission's proposal for the next long-term budget of the EU – the post 2020 Multiannual Financial Framework, will be made public in May 2018 and will have to distribute limited resources in a result-oriented way, addressing all the economic, social and geo-political challenges.

With the reflection process on the future of Europe already at a cruising speed, the Europa Forum Lech can contribute to the discussion on how to reshape and sustain the European project. At times when the very fundamentals of the EU are being questioned by populists, the European response should be a convincing one, given together by as many key actors as possible.
